



Formal Assessment of safe operability at the end of Stage one – Radlett CC return to training plan (v6)

Stage Two training is described in the stage two guidance as “the resumption of close contact (interaction within the two metre social distancing boundary) training where pairs, small groups and / or teams will be able to interact in much closer contact) Closer contact (within 2 m) should only be between essential players and staff and only for essential training activity. Outside of that activity, social distancing must be maintained.

However, the ECB Science and Medicine team advise that the “one skin – one ball” and 2 m social distancing should remain in place in training but that smaller group activity (maintain social distance can now begin)

The Stage 2 guidance requires a ‘formal assessment of safe operability at the end of stage one’.

Therefore, it is recommended that the updated risk assessment includes:

- 1. Carry out and document a review of the effectiveness of Stage 1 procedures in the COVID risk assessment: Step 2 RA has been modified accordingly for week commencing 6/07/2020.**
 - Were there any subsequent transmissions (ensure to record if zero)? **Zero recorded.**
 - Were there near misses or frequent contraventions of the control measures – are adaptations required? **None.**
 - Were practical adaptations required to meet training or player/coach needs? **No.**
 - Were adaptations to the initial risk assessment and control measures were required? **No**
- 2. Your risk assessment should include a document control record (assign a new revision number, record the date of revision and outline (in brief) that it has been updated in response to provision of the Stage 2 Guidance by the UK Government. Updated Risk Assessment Radlett CC – Step 2 03.07.2020.**
- 3. Once your risk assessment is complete you should issue the risk assessment to those who were issued the original document Circulated to all who were issued.**
- 4. Consider training/communications around changes to the risk assessment and how they apply to operations. Updated guidance given to players and coaches.**
- 5. The UK Government expects all organisations with more than 50 employees to publish their COVID-19 risk assessments and policies on their websites. Completed 03.07.20**
